Tweed Coast community Seaside is adding to its eco-credentials by partnering with Kleenheat Gas to become one of only a handful of developments in Northern New South Wales to offer residents access to a cost efficient, reticulated Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) system.

The initiative is another step forward for the pioneering community, which has planted more than 55,000 trees and plants on site as part of a major landscaping program, and recently became the first Tweed Coast development to install a Telstra Velocity system, delivering ultra fast broadband.

Seaside marketing manager Zel Creswick said the reticulated LPG system would be popular among home owners wanting to reduce their carbon footprint.
