Kleenheat Community Grants program returns for 2023

After a successful 2022 program, applications for the next round of Kleenheat Community Grants are now open.

Grants of up to \$1000 are on offer for community groups or not-for-profit organisations throughout regional Western Australia.

Kleenheat's Community Grants are provided across these five categories:

- Connected Communities growing stronger community relationships through activities that bring us together.
- **Inspiring Bright Minds** helping big-thinkers turn bright ideas into positive change.
- Health + Wellbeing being proactive in championing the benefits of a healthy mind and body.
- A Healthy Planet getting behind groups and causes committed to protecting our environment.
- Cultural Diversity understanding and celebrating the many cultures that enrich our communities.

Kleenheat started its current Community Grants program in 2020 and has since awarded \$100,000 in grants to community organisations across regional Western Australia and the Northern Territory.

Kleenheat General Manager, Tanya Rybarczyk said Kleenheat is a proudly Western Australian company that has been supplying gas to the state's regional communities for more than 65 years.

"We are the only gas supplier with a presence in all regions across the state. As a result, we get to see firsthand the exceptional work that West Australian community organisations do," Ms. Rybarczyk said.

"Local community programs and initiatives are usually run by volunteers and community members and are the glue that holds those communities together. We're delighted to be able to support regional go-getters in building stronger, healthier, and happier places to live."

"For example, last year we gave a grant to the Geraldton Water Polo Association, which it used to purchase goals for its junior team. Another grant was given to the Wyndham Youth Aboriginal Corporation which used its grant to buy a printer and computer equipment for local young people to use and access."


"Our grants program continues to make a big difference in local communities, and we encourage all eligible community groups in regional Western Australia to apply."


